

STOUT FAMILY ESTATE ANTIQUE AUCTION

All antiques and an interesting array of heirlooms have been moved from the Stout family home in Fort Scott, KS to the auction center in Greenwood, Missouri.



FAMILY HISTORY: The Stout's Victorian home was built in 1874 and they have lived there since coming to Fort Scott by covered wagon from Troy, Michigan. Before their immigration to Kansas, the family made several trips to Europe and Asia, returning with large stocks of linen, silver, china, glass, art, and many historic pieces.



FURNITURE: Mahogany bedroom grouping with the design of the 9 ft. headboard matching that of the marble-top dresser, commode and (2) chairs. This furniture has been stamped with Barnes MFG. C.O. Make Quick Selling, Walking, Riding, Cultivators, Freeport, Illinois. Cherry wood dining table that extends to 16 ft. and seats 24 guests. Only (2) tables were said to be made, one for President Grover Cleveland and one for the Stout family. It has (8) very high-backed matching chairs and a hutch. Aeolian Orchestrelle Organ, Chippendale chair, mahogany divan with extra high back, rocking chairs, sewing stand, sewing rocker, many dressers and vanities some with solid marble tops, rolltop parlor table, unique dresser with hidden drawer, large trunk with quilts, tiger oak file cabinet, oak stacking filing cabinets with approximately 30 drawers, kerosene lamps, oak bookcases, walnut table with chairs, walnut sideboard, curved-glass oak china cabinet with claw feet, several old Oriental rugs, many 1800s walnut chairs, antique chandeliers and light fixtures.



ANTIQUES/COLLECTIBLES: Matching pair of crystal pitchers, engraved with ship and the initials J.B., were presented to John Byrne, captain in the English Royal Navy. The authentic canvas oil painting of "Beatrice in Prison" by Achille Leonardi (1830/1840s) brought to America by Mr. Stout's grandparents in the early 1900s. Marble statues including one of the Biblical characters Ruth and Boaz, many sets of sterling flatware some engraved, service of (12) Dresden china that was hand painted by German artists, O. & E.G. Royal Austria china set.



AUCTIONEER'S NOTE: Do not miss this outstanding collection of rare antiques. Most items are 100-150 years old and are in mint condition. These antiques possess many unique features and are highly desirable.
